

English Year 6 Transition task

We are really looking forward to meeting you next academic year and would love to get to know you so, who better to tell us all about you than yourself?

TASK- All about me - Create a written information text all about you.

This could be:

- A letter
- A factsheet
- A PPT Presentation
- A comic strip (with writing/narration)
- A leaflet
- Or any other form you wish to use.

Things you could include:

- Information about you and your family (*names, family tree, interesting information*)
- Information about your personality (*Are you funny, grumpy, hardworking? Could you interview some friends and family to get them to give their views?*)
- Information about your hobbies or what you love (*Do you play a sport? Are you a member of a club? What's your interest? What lesson at school do you like best?*)
- Information about something you feel strongly about (*this could be a current or ongoing global issue, or something closer to home*)
- Information about your dreams and aspirations (*what do you want to be/do? What is your dream holiday/job/home?*)
- A funny anecdote from your life (*Is there something that has happened to you that just sums you up or is really funny?*)
- How you feel about starting Highfield (*what are you looking forward to? What are you apprehensive about?*)

✓ **Remember this is all about you, so you can include what you think is important and what you want to share.**

✓ **You can include pictures and colour if you wish to.**

Try to also think about:

- *Paragraphing and sentence types*- This is an information text so it needs to be easy for your audience to read and understand. What order are you going to put the information in?
- *Vocabulary and linguistic devices*- Just because this is a non-fiction text doesn't mean it has to be boring! Try to include some adventurous vocabulary and maybe some linguistic devices (simile, metaphor, emotive language, rhetorical questions etc.)
- *SPaG*- Remember to read through your work and edit it to ensure it makes sense and you have used the correct punctuation and spellings.
